

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT 2022/23

One of our fundamental objectives at MJCBY's Religious School is that our students enjoy coming to Religious School and feel at home at MJCBY. We continue to provide a high quality education in a warm and inclusive setting where children feel safe and happy; where students can use all their senses to engage in learning; and where learning is enjoyable, experiential and hands-on.

We have seen a strong increase in our youth programs past B'nai Mitzvah this past year as a direct result of our interactive curriculum: both our ALP and our USY attendance have grown. Our students are wanting to come back for more!

This year our enrollment consisted of 44 students, led by a staff of 6 teachers, 1 assistant teacher and 1 administrative assistant.

Cantor Shana led a fantastic monthly Junior Congregation (Grades 3 - 7) throughout the year, and an amazing twice weekly music class for the entire school

Our ALP group met regularly once a month for dinner, spirited discussions and more

Some 2022/23 Highlights reflecting our philosophy of interactive and joyful learning:

- Our opening day Pancake breakfast, followed by a Shofar workshop for the parents, was a great way to kick off the year
- We held a special RS Erev Yom Kippur Kol Nidrei service and a special RS Simchat Torah event.
- Our Rosh Hashanah & Yom Kippur Junior Congregation Services were enjoyed by students in grades 3 - 5
- We engaged students in a special year-long Jewish names project
- RS families enjoyed Sukkah programs and meals
- We had a petting zoo visit in honor of Parshat Noah!
- Our Board of Ed ran two well attended breakfast fundraisers
- Soferet Linda Coppleson guided our students through a very special Torah writing workshop
- Our Hanukkah Party was a hit - with a play directed by Cantor Shana and performed by grades 6 & 7 RS students, a Menorah contest with prizes, doughnuts, Hannukah activities and more
- Religious School students, teachers and families walked to the Morristown Green and enjoyed our community Hanukkah event there
- We celebrated two special Shabbat events per grade: Grades 3 - 5 gathered for a special Friday night service and dinner as well as a special Saturday morning Shabbat service and kiddush lunch. Grades 6 & 7 also met twice a year for the same. Our K - 2 students held a Havdalah program.
- In honor of Tu B'shvat we hosted an incredible Tu B'shvat Seder where we also got to meet our incoming Rabbi
- In honor of Jewish Disability Awareness, Acceptance & Inclusion Month we hosted a very special event with the Morristown Seeing Eye
- Our Purim Party Shpiel and Carnival were so much fun!
- Our Pesach Model Seder organized and led by Cantor Shana was once again INCREDIBLE
- Mitzvah day was a wonderful opportunity for our students to join the community in helping those in need
- Our older students enjoyed the movie Paper Clips and discussion in honor of Yom Hashoah
- We celebrated Yom Ha'atzmaut with an exciting Israel day (Israeli dancing, live broadcast from the Kotel reading of Megillat Ha'atzmaut, crafts and activities for the kids, Israeli lunch...)

- Our year ended with a special End of Year celebration and service led by our graduating class. Students presented Rabbi Nesson with Thank you cards and posters and a song written for the occasion by Lux Onigman.
